

45% increase in shots fired from 2019-2020

64% increase in non-fatal shootings from 2019-2020









Shots Fired | Spatial Concentration

Groups Drive Violence



Violence is highly concentrated

Geographic concentration

Demographic concentration

Social concentration (group dynamics)

The most serious violence involves a very small number of people

Groups are at the **center of the violence**, both as victims and as perpetrators

Strategies



The fact that a very small number of people are at very high risk for violence means that many of our usual "big" explanations, and the interventions they suggest, are less on point than we think

What is GVI?




GVI is an evidence based strategy that has repeatedly demonstrated that violence can be dramatically reduced when community members stand and act together with law enforcement and social service providers to focus on a three-pronged anti-violence message on highly active street groups



Problem Analysis





Focus on High Risk Groups



Identify in real time small numbers of the highest risk people and groups

Open lines of direct and respectful communication with them

Establish clear standards against violence and for safety and success from people influential with those at highest risk Offer meaningful support to keep people safe, alive, and out of prison Reserve

Custom Notifications



173 complete

35 reoffended with a weapon (20% recidivism rate)

77 families reached out for services

Over 40 community members trained in Custom Notifications





Law Enforcement

DAVENPORT

Crime Analysis Review | Quarterly review of gun related incidents to ensure those at highest risk of violence are notified

Custom Notification Records | Systematize record keeping of those custom notified so all officers are aware when interacting with individuals

Prosecution | Partnered with SCAO to request cash only bonds at initial court appearance for violent offenders who have reoffended after being custom notified

Law Enforcement

DAVENPORT

Shooting Review | Operationalized a weekly meeting to review all shootings and determine best course of action with partners. Includes all QCA law enforcement and Federal partners







Information Sharing



- Creates critically important mechanism for moving LE information out of LE and supporting community interventions
- LE usually has the most organized and operation information on group violence
- This information can be acted upon by non-LE partners
- The more effective that non-LE action is, the less enforcement is needed and the more the legitimacy of the partnership and GVI is enhanced




