You need to know

- The backfill phase out is being negotiated and your outreach is critical. Your voice is needed immediately to help protect the backfill.
 Contact your House Representative and tell them to oppose phasing out the backfill and vote no on any proposal which does so.
- The U.S. Treasury released guidance on the resources available to cities through the American Rescue Plan. Join the League for a presentation with the National League of Cities on the guidance on Monday, May 17 at 2 p.m. Registration is required.
- Legislative Per Diem ended on April 30, but session continues. The House, Senate, and Governor will need to agree on a few key issues, such as the backfill, before adjournment Sine Die.

SF 619 | Governor/Senate Tax Omnibus Phases Out Backfill

- This legislation contains language that would defund the local government property tax relief, known as the backfill, that was implemented in 2013.
- The Iowa Senate has been inflexible in their desire to remove the 2013 property tax relief known as the backfill. The Iowa House has demonstrated a willingness to maintain this property tax relief by introducing and moving <u>HF 893</u>.

HF 893 | House Tax Omnibus

- Contains many provisions such as an increase to the Housing Trust Fund, Workforce Housing Tax Credits, Brownfield and Grayfield development incentives, Rural Economic Development Tax Credits and the Emergency Volunteer Tax Credit.
- Scheduled to pass through the House Appropriation Committee on Monday, May 17.
- Currently, the League is registered in support of this proposal because it maintains the backfill. However, we have concerns that through negotiations, the backfill will be phased out. Please contact your legislator and either thank them for their support of the backfill or urge them to vote no on a proposal which phases out the backfill.

HF 797 & SF 342 | Public Safety Benefit Increase

- These two bills seek to increase support and benefits to public safety
 officers through various measures which include increasing MFPRSI
 benefits, requiring an officer's accrued sick leave to be paid to the
 officer upon retirement, codifying qualified immunity and many
 others.
- While no progress on these proposals have been made in the last few weeks, it is possible they are brought up and passed in the final days of session.
- You are encouraged to read these bills and contact your Senator with any concerns or questions you may have.
